



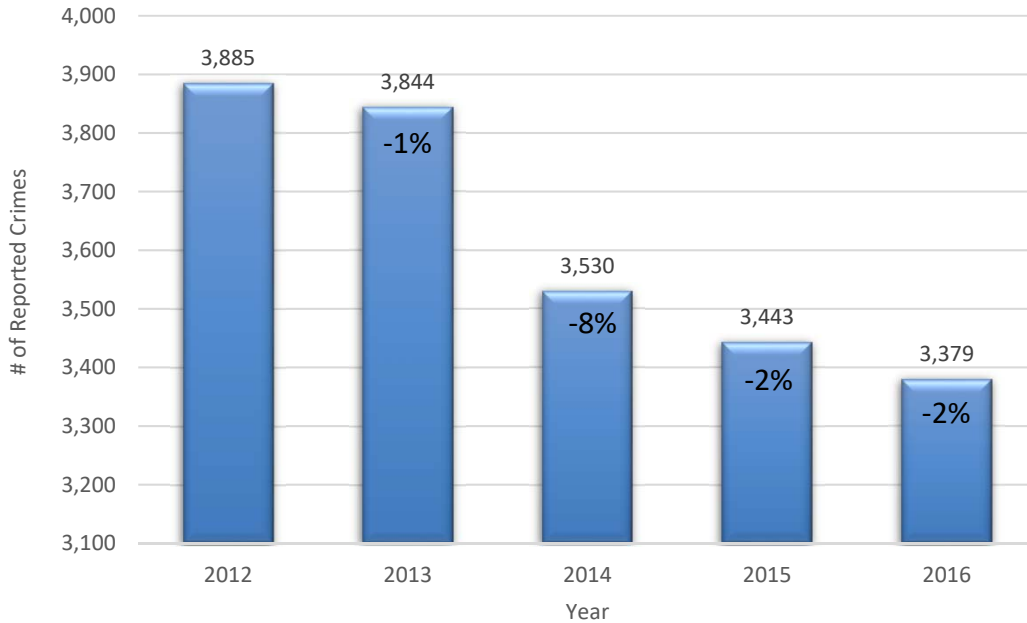

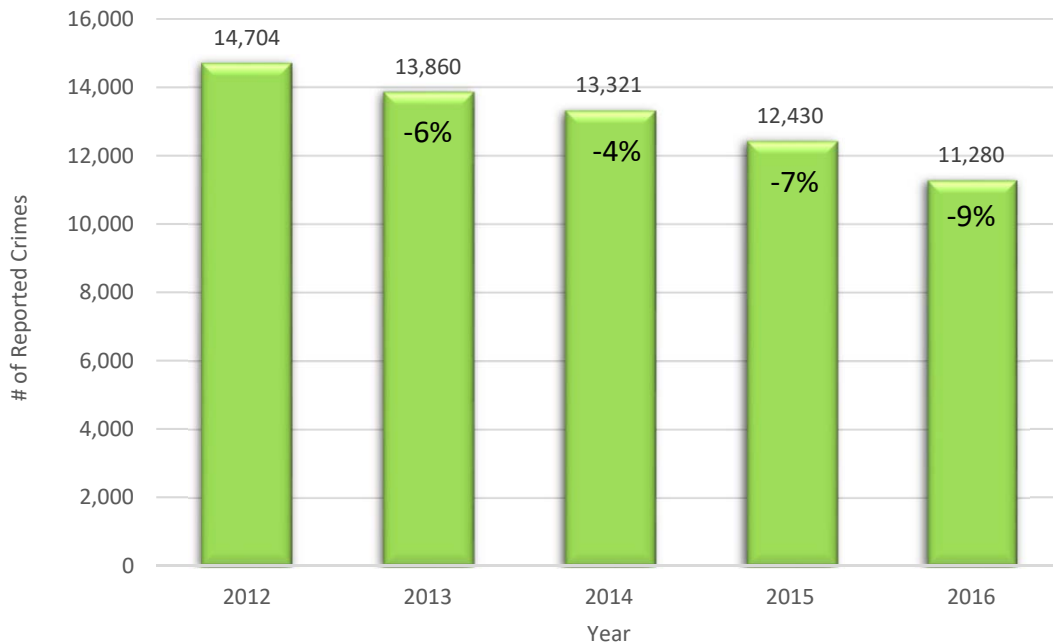


Part I & II crimes are crime that are uniformly identified by law enforcement agencies as a baseline for activity within an agency's jurisdiction.

2012-2016 PART I REPORTED CRIME COMPARISON



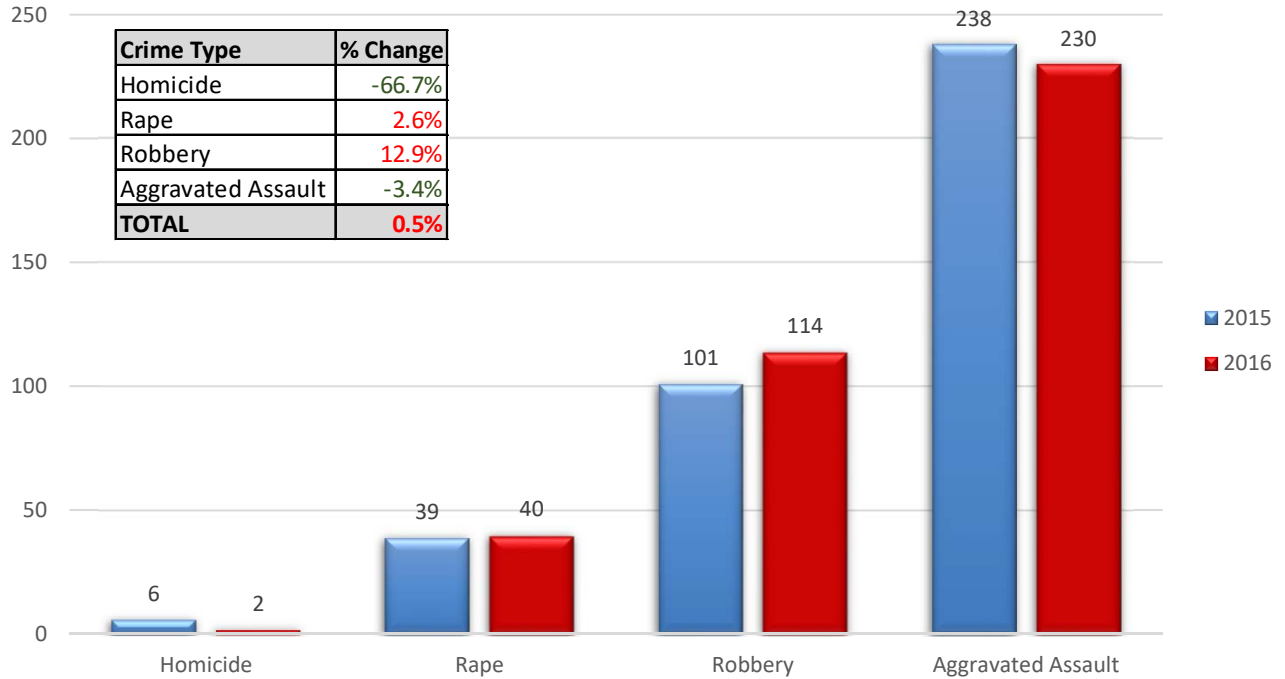
2012-2016 PART I & PART II REPORTED CRIME COMPARISON



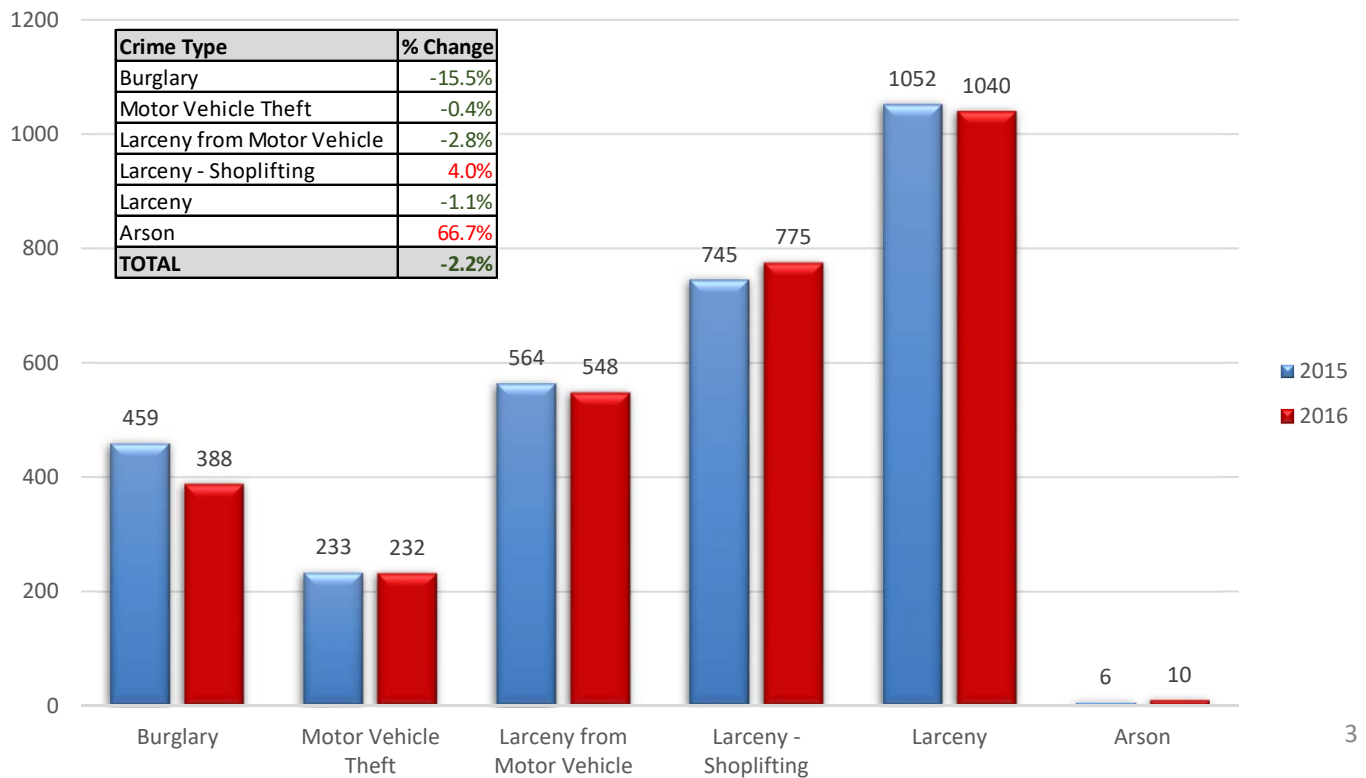


Part I crimes can be divided into Violent Crimes and Property Crimes.

2015/2016 PROPERTY CRIME COMPARISON





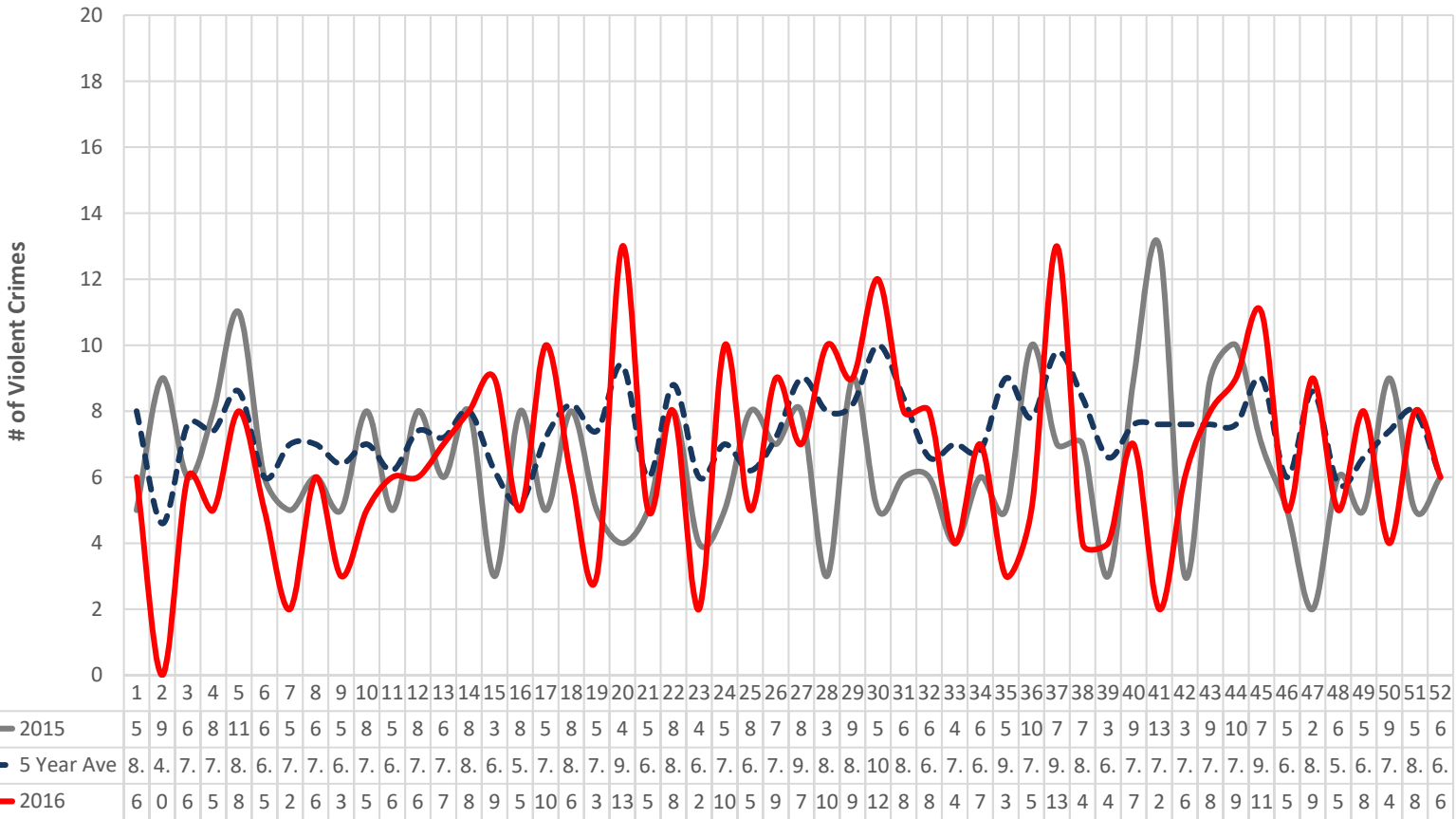
Part I crime is down 1.9% overall for 2016 in comparison to 2015.

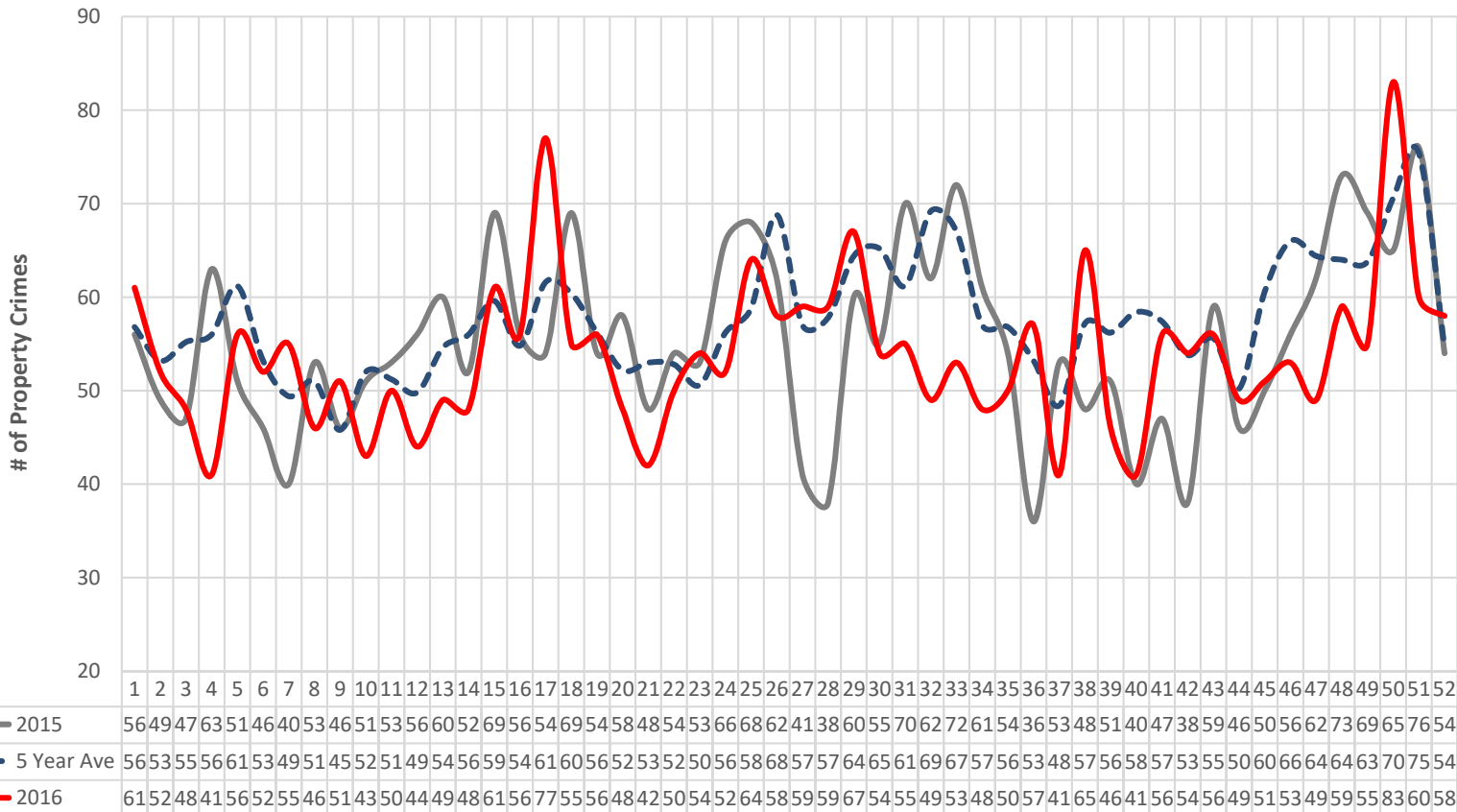

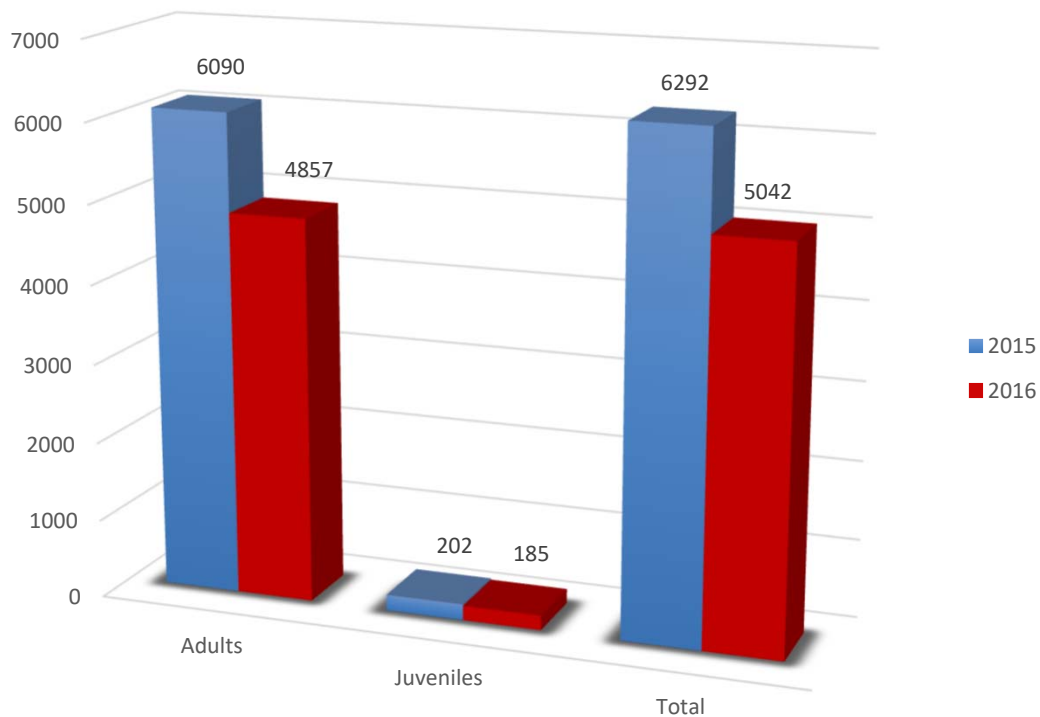

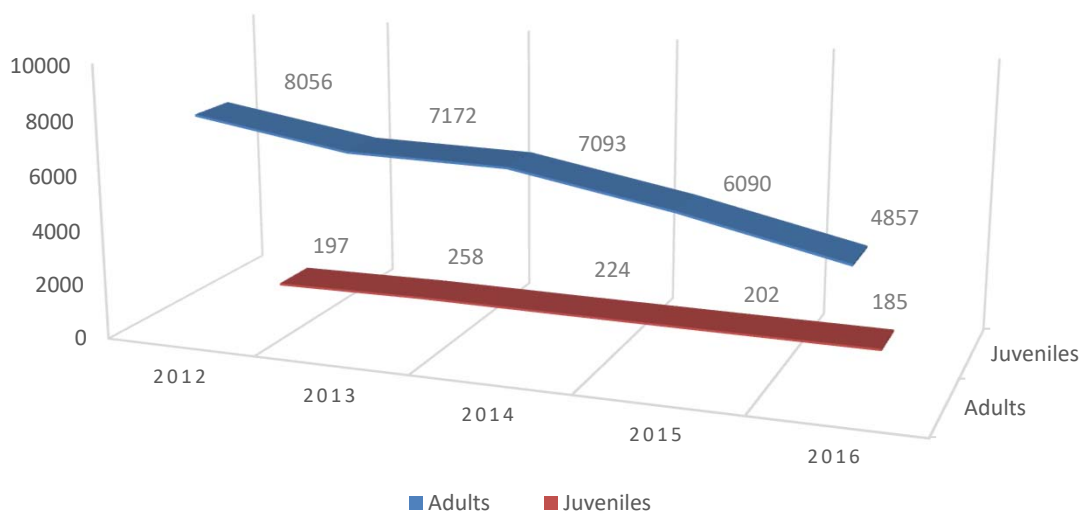


Adults arrested and juveniles detained for 2016 totaled 5042 compared to 6254 in 2015 which is a 20% decrease.

Adults arrested in 2016 decreased by 20% compared with 2015. Juveniles detained decreased by 8% compared with 2015.

Since 2013, both adults arrested and juveniles detained have decreased each year.

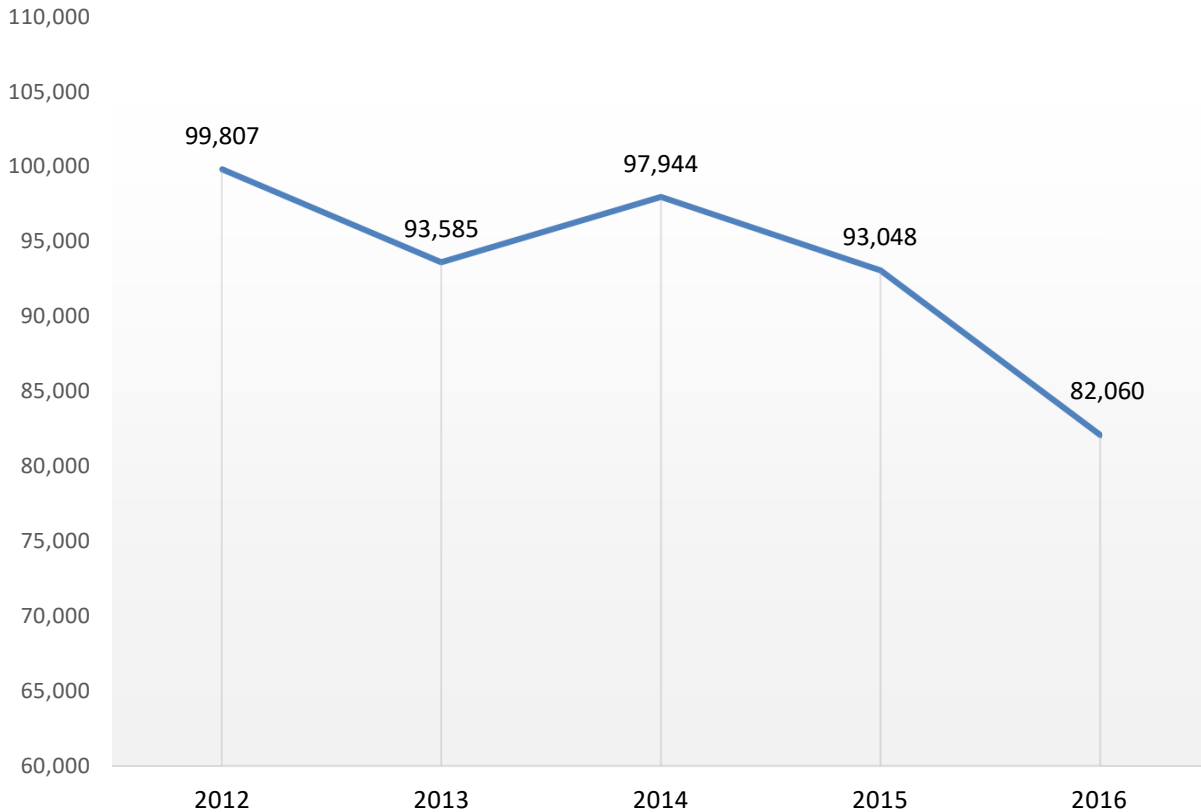
The Violent crime clearance rate is up 8% for 2016 compared with 2015.

FIVE YEAR CALLS FOR SERVICE COMPARISON

A call for service (CFS) is generated for nearly everything that an officer does while on duty. This includes traffic stops, residential security checks, lost children, or major criminal events. Criminal and non-criminal incidents are documented. In 2016, the number of calls for service decreased by **11.8%**.

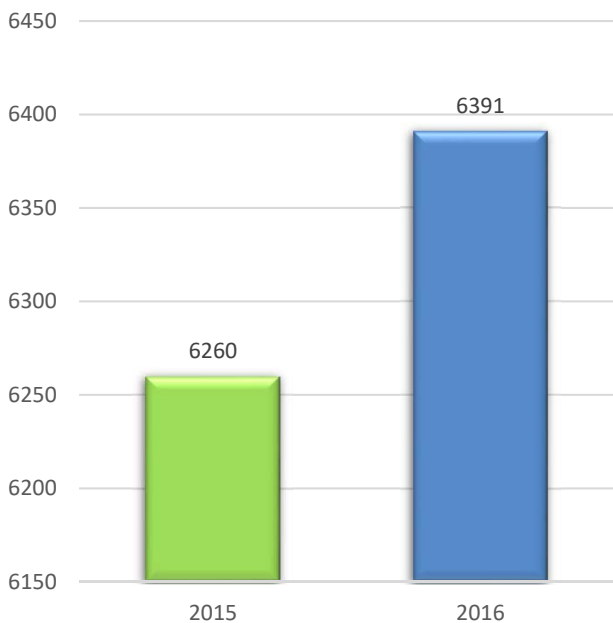

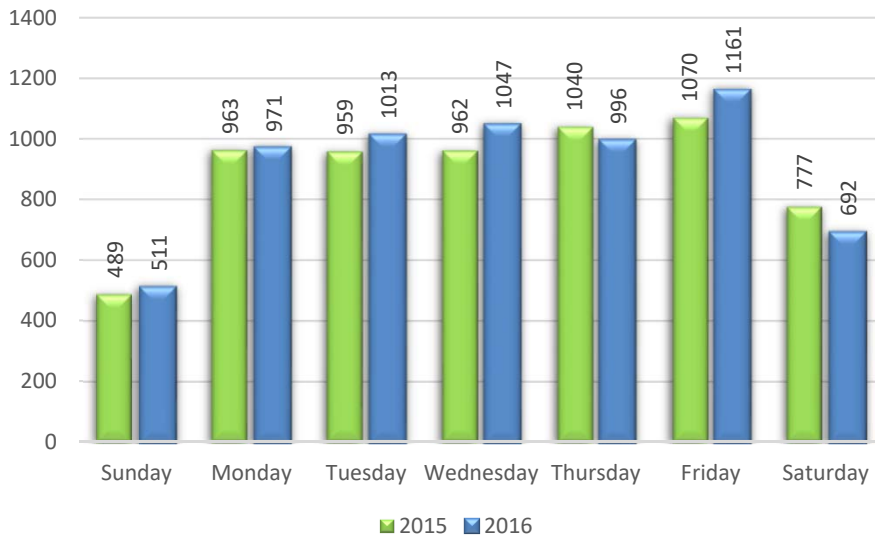
A comprehensive analysis of traffic collisions has been completed for calendar year 2016. Historical data was collected from internal traffic bureau files, Greenville County Records, and Greenville Police crime analysis files. 6,391 collisions were reviewed for empirical statistics.

2015/2016 Collisions by Day of Week



Trends indicate that the vast majority of collisions (68.5%) continue to occur Monday through Friday from approximately 0700 hours until 1900 hours (75.3%). The most prolific day of the week is Friday (18.2%) and the most prolific time of day is 1700-1759 hours (9.8%).
